My favorite local pop/rock, roots and jazz CDs of 2013





Here are my picks for the year's best local CDs:

Best Roots CD/Album of the Year: "Upon That Hill" by the Short Straw Pickers (theshortstrawpickers.com). The singing core of guitarist Jack Schueler, multistringed instrumentalist Billy Gilmore and upright bassist Jeff Adkins is impressive enough from the loping open-er "Open Road" to comic closer "Free Horse." Add violinist and New Jersey transplant Brian Purwin, who creates a two-man bowed string section with Adkins on "Wiley's Cove" and goes Stephane Grappelli on "Momentum," and you get one of the best bluegrass discs ever by a South Florida artist.

Best Pop/Rock CD: "Fall of This Town" by Sean Hanley (facebook. com/seanhanleyinfo). A compelling debut by the 45-year-old Boynton Beach singer/songwriter, this CD's cast includes singing guitarist and bassist Rick Rossano, drummer Mike Vullo, keyboardist/vocalist Marc Ward and an array of guests. A heavy Beatles influence permeates standout tracks
